The 1st India-Arab Universities' Presidents' **■** Conference, held on 5–6 February at Sushma Swaraj Bhawan in New Delhi, marked a significant milestone in fostering academic collaboration between India and the Arab world. Organized by the Indian Ministry of External Affairs in association with the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the League of Arab States (LAS), the conference brought together over 100 Indian and more than 45 Arab university presidents to explore new avenues for cooperation in higher education.

The conference was inaugurated with a keynote address by Indian Minister of State for External Affairs, Shri Kirti Vardhan Singh and insightful contributions by the Secretary General of the Association of Arab Universities. Discussions focused on the potential for development and prosperity through educational collaboration.

Session 2: Innovative and New Areas of

highlighted opportunities in Al, Quantum Computing, and Biotechnology. I had the honor of participating in this panel alongside Prof. Hatem Elmasri from Applied Science University, Bahrain. We discussed the importance of creating a robust framework for joint research initiatives, which could lead to groundbreaking innovations and advancements.

Session 5: Framework for Promoting Faculty & Student Exchange: This session focused on promoting cultural exchange and academic collaboration through structured exchange programs. Speakers included Prof. Amer Alhinai from Sultan Qaboos University, Oman, and Prof. Imad Dawoud Al-Zeer from Palestine Ahliya University.

Discussion on Outcomes: Moderated by representatives from UGC and the Arab

Universities Presidents Association, this session facilitated an open discussion on the outcomes and recommendations of the conference.

In the Closing Ceremony, the conference concluded with valedictory remarks by the Secretary (CPV & OIA), Ministry of External Affairs, India. It is noteworthy that Kuwait College of Science and Technology (KCST) was the sole institution representing Kuwait at the conference. KCST was presented as a model for collaboration between India and the Arab world, given that its initial curriculum was established by professors from The Indian Institute of Technology - IIT Delhi. This collaboration underscores the potential for academic excellence through international partnerships.

The conference concluded with a session on promoting faculty and student exchange and cooperation in curriculum development. The Secretary of UGC chaired the closing ceremony, delivering the valedictory address. Key outcomes and recommendations from the conference included:

Establishing Joint Research Centres: To facilitate collaborative research and innovation. Enhancing Digital Learning Platforms: To improve access to quality education across borders.

Mutual Recognition of Degrees: Developing standardized frameworks for recognizing academic qualifications.

Faculty and Student Exchange Programs: Promoting cultural exchange and academic collaboration through structured exchange programs.

Revitalizing American Industry: A Conversation with FCC Commissioner Nathan Simington

The United States is losing its grip on industrial and technological ▲ dominance, and China is filling the void. Years of naïve economic policies and misplaced faith in unregulated free markets have left the United States vulnerable.

In a candid discussion with Reconnaissance Research founder and CEO Abdulaziz Al-Anjeri, the United States Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Commissioner Nathan Simington delivers a blunt assessment of how China has overtaken the US in key sectors such as telecommunications, shipbuilding, and advanced manufacturing.

Simington, pulls no punches in his critique of America's economic missteps and the urgent need for a national industrial strategy.

He lays out a stark warning: If the US fails to act decisively, it will fall further behind, with devastating consequences for both economic security and national defense.

In your article, you highlight 'unforced errors' and 'economic distortions' in US policy that contributed to China's trade dominance. What specific policy missteps do you believe were most damaging?

"The most damaging policy misstep is really just the way we do accounting and corporate valuation in the United States. There is an incentive to get expensive assets off balance sheets in order to facilitate off-balance sheet financing and to create the appearance, if not the reality, of better returns relative to balance sheet size. Every public company in the United States is incentivized to play this shell game; unfortunately, China took the other side of that bet. China now holds the expensive, productive assets that American firms offloaded. And while that might not be a problem when any individual American firm does it, yet when they all do it we've created a systemic offshoring crisis, particularly in advanced manufacturing. This perhaps isn't an issue at the level of, say, 1980s Mexican maguiladoralevel product manufacturing and packaging—manually filling shampoo bottles with ladles, where cost of labor predominates. But when all of your advanced electronics, including all of their rare earth inputs, come from the same few square miles of China because American firms would rather rent than buy, you've just created a crisis of national security and economic resiliency because public markets are accustomed to over indexing against productive assets.

"I say 'public company' because the world's richest man is an industrialist who manufactures in the United States but keeps most of his business interests privately held. Public-company finance exists as a way to invest the savings of the middle classes; to the extent that this proves an inadequate model, inherently or because of its long-standing regulatory complexion, the US must simply consider alternatives for the social functions that public companies presently serve."

Your analysis critiques a 'naïve free markets' approach to trade. How do you reconcile the need for market freedom with the necessity of safeguarding national industrial interests?

"Markets are very good at a lot of things. Command socialism doesn't work because it subverts three norms that markets require to operate: allocation of resources through market-based price discovery; incentives to invest; and property rights. These truly are engines of progress, innovation, and wealth without which we



cannot do, and I do not intend to suggest otherwise. Having said that, naïve capitalism is the idea that free participation in an efficient, minimally-regulated but strongly-enforced market is the primary, or even sole, consideration with which a nation state should concern itself as it orders its economy. The 'spherical cow' in this assumption is the idea that security is a given, which is a luxury belief that most countries can't afford; perhaps the United States can no longer afford

it either. This thinking created our allergy to industrial policy, for instance. We no longer live in a unipolar

> world in which American capitalists enjoy the luxury of concerning ourselves exclusively with our own enterprises without regard to a larger social and security context.

Economic security is national security, but tautologies can also be read backwards—and that means that national security considerations can, and should, guide national thinking in economic development. And,

frankly, we need to find a way to get our heads around, and even formally model, the cost overhang of systemic threats to national security that may arise. For instance, if we have built our national communications networks using cheap and easilycompromised electronics acquired for pennies from global rivals, we may have assumed costs to security and intellectual property outstripping any possible price savings."

You write that China's industrialization was "a conscious, targeted choice." What specific lessons can the U.S. realistically adopt from China's playbook?

"China is the world leader in advanced manufacturing not because it has the best people or processes, but because it directed the entire heft of the state toward that specific purpose. When the United States acts with national purpose toward technological enterprise, we get the space program, Bell Labs, and the internet. What do we have like that now? We have a program here, a bill there, but the nearest approximation we have of national purpose is bipartisanship—and most bipartisan 'achievements' have nothing of national purpose within them, but instead are shambolic grab-bags of priorities for which it is difficult or impossible to tell which way the arrow of effort

And even when you can discern what the goal was, the program is constructed in such a way as to functionally preclude its accomplishment—problems are not solved, but merely perpetually

'addressed.' Perhaps, for some career politicians and civil servants, this is more congenial than it is for the public. At any rate: it's time to pick a technological domain, any domain, and achieve seriousminded clarity around its execution. I, personally, would like to see us land a person on Mars. I'm certain China will if we don't.

"Chinese leadership in this area, incidentally, imposes significant national security costs on the United States and on its friends and partners abroad. If Chinese products and industrial operations technologies are the market leaders and there are no Western alternatives, then every country must make the unpalatable choice between going 100 percent Chinese, or remaining a tech generation behind. In 2023, I met with US Navy Secretary Carlos Del Toro at the National Press Club in Washington, DC. He highlighted that US naval shipyards cannot match the output of Chinese ones, noting that 'they have 13 shipyards, and in some cases, one of their shipyards has more capacity than all of ours combined'."

How urgent is the need to revitalize the US militaryindustrial base?

'Cost-plus pricing for United States prime military contractors is a great way to ensure that costs stay high even if margins stay fixed, which means that executives get their bonuses

indexed for revenue growth, but no one is really held to account for profitability. That should change for many reasons, not least of which is that high margin businesses tend to invest more in R&D than other businesses. But tabling that for the moment: we have precious little state capacity in all kinds of heavy industries. Shipbuilding is a dire example. We have two icebreakers in the United States, one of which is sent to

the southern hemisphere for six months of the year and then has to spend two in dry dock in Seattle because of the undue strain put on it from overuse. We are buying icebreakers that Sweden doesn't use anymore because we can't make one ourselves. We can't lay undersea cable, either, because we can't build the ships for that—China can. And does. When we think about security and resiliency, I don't think we should be counting national security assets of any class by the 1s and 2s, nor should we be relying on rivals or adversaries to build things for us."

In areas like telecommunications and electric vehicles, China has emerged as the undisputed global leader. Is it realistic for the US to regain dominance in these sectors, or should it focus on new frontiers?

"When it comes to electric vehicles or telecommunications, the United States has no choice. We must be dominant in these fields. There is no other option. This is a situation where, at least when it comes to global powers, second place is the first loser. And, to take an example with which I am familiar—telecommunications—this can have a lot to do with the way international bodies develop consensus on standards for commercial operation of telecommunications technology. When China does another greenfield installation of a Huawei 5G network in a developing Latin American country, it has bought a delegate at the International Telecommunication Union and put a big microphone in our hemisphere to boot. There's very little to say: the situation is manifestly unacceptable."



Kuwait, Uzbekistan to expand and deepen cooperation

President of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev, praised Kuwait's efforts to preserve peace and ensure stability in the Middle East. The Uzbek president was speaking on his arrival in Kuwait on a state visit at the invitation of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah,

In addition, the Uzbek President extended his congratulations to His Highness the Amir on the occasion of the upcoming National Days of the State of Kuwait, celebrating the sixty-fourth anniversary of independence and the thirtyfourth anniversary of liberation.

The talks between the two leaders aimed at strengthening ties between the two countries and took place in a spirit of friendship and trust. The Uzbek President expressed his gratitude to His Highness the Amir for his warm welcome and hospitality. In a joint statement issued during the two-day visit on 17–18 February, the two leaders affirmed their commitment to expanding and deepening the comprehensive cooperation between their countries.

The statement added that His Highness the Amir commended the President of Uzbekistan for his efforts in strengthening peace and security, good neighborliness, and promoting the integration processes in Central Asia. His Highness the Amir also welcomed Uzbekistan's chairmanship in the Consultative Meetings of the Heads of State, and its role in advancing regional connectivity and sustainable development.

President of Uzbekistan congratulated the State of Kuwait on assuming the presidency of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) this year, and both sides praised the development of relations between the GCC and the counties of Central Asia. The two sides welcomed the upcoming 2nd summit of the leaders of the GCC countries with the Central Asian countries, which is set to be held in the Uzbek city of Samarkand,. For their part, the Kuwaiti side, in its capacity as the current chair of the GCC, affirmed its full support for deepening cooperation between

the GCC and the Central Asian Countries, in all dimensions

Based on the scale of cooperation between Kuwait and Uzbekistan, the two sides reaffirmed the importance of strengthening political dialogue, trade and economic relations, cultural and humanitarian exchanges, and cooperation between security, defense, and law enforcement agencies. The joint statement by the two countries stressed the following points:

Both parties agreed to continue efforts to develop comprehensive premierships in all mutually beneficial areas. They also stressed the importance of holding annual political consultations on a tum-by-tum basis at the level of senior officials to exchange views on the agenda of bilateral relations, as well as discuss common interests, and global issues.

The parties highlighted the importance of the first Ministerial meeting of the Intergovernmental Joint Commission on Trade, Economic and Technical Cooperation, which was held in Tashkent from 19-21 November last year. This meeting set the agenda for broadening joint projects in areas such as finance, trade, digital economy, investment, energy, construction and transport infrastructure, innovations, renewable energy, agriculture, manpower, culture, tourism, and education, The Kuwaiti side expressed its intention to encourage the private sector through the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Kuwait, to explore the potential of investments in Uzbekistan, while the Uzbek side stressed its readiness to attract Kuwaiti investors and provide the necessary assistance in accordance with their respective legislations.

The two parties have reached an agreement to exchange technologies and experiences aimed at improving crop and livestock productivity to contribute to improving food security through cooperation in both the public and private sector in both countries.

Kuwait and Uzbekistan underlined the necessity to strengthen joint efforts in establishing direct and regular air communication between the two countries, as well as in further developing the tourism sector along with simplifying the required procedures for these purposes. The two sides have agreed to expand cooperation aimed at improving public health, and to exchange best practices in healthcare, medicine, and pharmaceuticals and continue the dialogue in the field of the medical system built on information and communication technologies. The parties expressed solidarity on establishing and strengthening ties between defense, security and law enforcement agencies, as well as on expanding cooperation in the areas of personnel training, information and communication technologies, artificial intelligence, and cyber security.

Both countries underscored the importance of respecting the territorial integrity and sovereignty of states, non-interference in their internal affairs, peaceful resolution of conflicts on the basis of the UN Charter and interactional law. The parties expressed the intention to further promote the existing and new forms of cooperation in culture, education, science, sports, tourism and people's diplomacy in order to strengthen the friendship and links between the two peoples.

The two countries agreed to establish mutual exchanges of scientists and specialists in the field of preservation, protection, exploitation, digital management and restoration of archaeological, artistic and cultural heritage and implement joint programs and projects in this regard, as well as to carry out other forms of cooperation through joint activities in the area of information and experience sharing.

The parties noted the importance of further expansion of cooperation in the field of higher education through strengthening premiership relations between higher education institutions, exchange of teaching staff and students, expansion of scholarship programs, and the creation of joint educational programs between faculties and higher education institutions.

The parties reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening security, peace and stability on a regional and global scale and expressed

readiness to further expand cooperation within the framework of the United Nations, the Organization of Islamic Cooperation, the Non-Aligned Movement among other international organizations.

Furthermore, the Uzbek side welcomed the Kuwaiti initiative to transform the Asian Cooperation Dialogue (ACD) into a regional organization. Both parties expressed satisfaction with the fruitful outcomes of the official visit of His Excellency Shavkat Mirziyoyev, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, to the State of Kuwait and underscored that this visit has become a significant basis for enhancing the existing comprehensive partnership between both countries.

His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah and visiting President of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev oversaw on 17 February the signing of four agreements during official rounds of talks.

Present at the signing ceremony at Bayan Palace were His Highness the Crown Prince Sheikh Sabah Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, and Acting Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Fahad Yusuf Saud Al-Sabah.

The first agreement between the two countries focused on expanding cooperation within the labor force in the private sector. It was signed by Acting Prime Minister Sheikh Fahad Al-Yusuf and Uzbek Foreign Minister Baxtiyor Saidov. The second agreement was a protocol to amend an agreement on air cargo cooperation signed by Kuwaiti Foreign Minister Abdullah Al-Yahya and his Uzbek counterpart Saidov.

The third agreement was to develop cooperation between the two sides within the domain of smart cities. It was signed by Minister of State for Municipal Affairs and Minister of State for Housing Abdullatif Al-Meshari and Uzbek Foreign Minister Saidov.

The fourth agreement was within the sector of industrial cooperation sign by Minister of Commerce and Industry Khalifa Al-Askar and Uzbekistan's Minister of Industry, Trade and Investment Laziz Kudratov.

Kuwait became a fully independent nation on 19 June 1961, following an exchange of letters with the United Kingdom, which abrogated the Anglo-Kuwaiti Protectorate Treaty of 1899 that accorded Kuwait a Protectorate status under Great Britain. Kuwait's path towards independence was spearheaded by Sheikh Abdullah Al-Salem Al-Sabah, the 11th ruler (1950-1961) and first Amir of Kuwait. To commemorate the ascension of Sheikh Abdullah on 25 February 1950, Kuwait decided in 1964 to advance the annual observance of National Day from 19 June to 25 February.

In the early decades of independence, the country's oil wealth made Kuwait one of the most developed countries in the Arab world, introducing social, cultural, and political initiatives that made Kuwait an outlier among peers in the region. Kuwait embraced a democratic form of governance, with a constitution, universal franchise, and a vibrant parliamentary life.

In the 1960s and 70s Kuwait was known for its liberal social values, progressive views, and non-traditional attitudes, with the country soon becoming a regional cultural hub, famed for its freedom of expression and liberal media. 




